## CALIFORNIA AUTHORITY OF RACING FAIRS Board of Directors Tuesday, November 8, 2011

**MINUTES** 

A teleconference meeting of the California Authority of Racing Fairs Board of Directors was held at 12:30 P.M., Tuesday, November 8, 2011, via teleconference.

CARF Board Members joining by conference call: John Alkire, Norb Bartosik, Dan Jacobs, Mike Paluszak and Kelly Violini.

Staff and Guests joining by conference call: Christopher Korby, Larry Swartzlander, Heather Haviland, Amelia White, Rick Wood, Raechelle Gibbons, Rebecca Desmond, and Tom Sawyer.

**Agenda Item 1 – Date, Time and Location of Next Meeting.** The next CARF Board of Directors meeting will be scheduled for December 6, 2011 in Sacramento.

**Agenda Item 2 – Approval of Minutes**. Norb Bartosik moved to approve the meeting minutes as presented. Dan Jacobs second, unanimously approved.

Agenda Item 3 – Report, Discussion and Action, if any, on Legislative Program for 2012. Mr. Korby reported that he and Mr. Brown are in the initial stages of putting together a recommendation for the 2012 legislative program. Staff will be considering Fair funding, Fair governance and license fee elimination for racing Fairs. Mr. Korby encouraged members to contact him with any legislative concerns that would be appropriate to address in 2012.

Agenda Item 4 – Report, Discussion and Action, if any, on CDFA Fairs' Consortium, Fairs Funding and Re-Structuring Fair Governance. Ms. Desmond reported that Secretary Ross spoke about the Consortium process during the WFA Fall Manager's Conference. Mr. Korby gave a concise recap on the progress made by the Working Group on Restructuring Fair Governance. The Secretary is working on her recommendation to the Governor (due November 15), which will not be made available to Fairs until after it has been presented to the Governor. The Secretary is incorporating the feedback she received in an effort to provide a simple and straightforward solution that allows for flexibility at the community level. The goal of this group is to transition Fairs from District Agriculture Associations to local entities through an alternative governance option that will maximize the retention and growth of fairgrounds and state employees.

Mr. Alkire thanked Mr. Korby and Ms. Desmond for their participation in the process.

Agenda Item 5 – Report, Discussion and Action, if any, on Use of CARF Project Funds for Operational Support by Member Fairs. Mr. Korby reported that this item was also on the agenda for the CARF Live Racing Committee and was unanimously approved.

Staff is requesting that the CARF Board of Directors consider approving the use of horse racing capital improvement project funds previously allocated by F&E for general Fair operations. Mr. Korby stated current economic hardships placed on Fairs by the elimination of state funding has necessitated reconsideration of the position that CARF has long maintained of only using capital improvement funds for the projects approved when funding was secured. In the current economic environment CARF can benefit its member Fairs by approving use of project funds for operational purposes.

Mr. Paluszak asked that that Fairs provide written "notification" in lieu of a written "request."

Mr. Jacobs moved to authorize Fairs to use racing capital improvement funds for general operational purposes with a provision that each Fair provide written notification outlining the intent to use the funds for purposes other than the projects submitted at the time funds were secured. Mr. Bartosik seconded, unanimously approved.

Agenda Item 6 – Report, Discussion and Action, if any, on Status of Totalisator contract. Mr. Korby reported that Stronach Group management is discussing installing Am Tote as a totalisator system at their tracks throughout North America, including Golden Gate Fields and Santa Anita (the Stronach Group owns Am Tote). This development might create a situation where either two tote systems will be operating simultaneously in California or all California tracks convert to a new tote system. California industry principals went through an extensive RFP process several years ago to establish one tote system in California with great success. Mr. Korby will keep the group updated as conversations progress.

**Agenda Item 7 – Report on Progress of Working Group on Allocation of CARF dues.** Mr. Korby reported that the small working group tasked with reviewing the allocation of CARF dues will meet again tomorrow (November 9, 2011) at 2:00 p.m.

**Agenda Item 8 – Financials.** Mr. Jacobs asked if there were any issues regarding the accounts receivable that the CARF Board should convene on. Ms. Gibbons replied that with the Board action to allow Fairs to use project funds for general operational expenses, she will be backing out many of the invoices that are currently showing as account receivable.

**Agenda Item 9 – Executive Director's Report.** Mr. Korby reported that Bill Blair has agreed to serve as Chairman of the CARF Nominations Committee to fill two open seats on the CARF board. One seat is an expiring term held by Norb Bartosik. Mr. Bartosik has indicated he will seek reelection. The other seat is an at-large vacancy previously held by Vince Agnifili.

# INTERNET POKER LEGISLATION CALIFORNIA HORSE RACING INDUSTRY TENETS OF AGREEMENT

 Revenues generated by the California horse racing industry from the conduct of internet poker shall be distributed amongst racing industry participants according to traditional parimutuel distributions.

- 2. Revenue generated from internet poker and distributed to racing associations or Fairs shall be used for the purposes of upgrading and improving racing venues and satellite wagering facilities, based on a formula agreed to by industry participants. The formula shall include a percentage of revenue and a total dollar amount cap.
- 3. Selection of a service provider(s) to operate an internet poker site on behalf of the California horse racing industry shall be determined as follows:
  - i. Fifty percent (50%) and right-of-consent to the organization recognized as representing Thoroughbred horsemen in California.
  - ii. Fifty percent (50%) to racing associations and Fairs.
- 4. Legislation authorizing licenses to conduct internet poker in California shall include the following:
  - i. A license prescribed and reserved specifically for the California horse racing industry.
  - ii. A limited number of licenses available for conduct of on-line poker.
  - iii. Licenses shall only be available for California-based businesses, tribes or industries.

### California Authority of Racing Fairs INTERNET POKER LEGISLATION

#### Issues, Considerations and Positions

- Initial position: Support the racing industry's legislative effort for equal
  opportunity for license to conduct internet poker. This will keep us (racing
  industry and Fairs) at the table as an interested and affected player. [This
  position will also best ensure a fall-back position in which the racing industry
  takes a share of the proceeds rather than operating its own license.]
- IMPORTANT: Racing has the only legal, existing CA on-line gaming
  presence: Make the case that the racing industry is the only entity licensed in CA
  for on-line wagering. We have conducted that activity legally and responsibility
  for years. Any new on-line gambling will cannibalize our existing business,
  which supports a California industry, California agriculture and California jobs.
- Fairs as Beneficiaries: Fairs in the racing business (CARF) want to receive their fair share of any financial benefits that can be realized from internet poker.
   Those benefits should flow both to live racing Fairs and to satellite wagering Fairs.
- Racing Industry Beneficiaries of Poker Revenues: Financial benefits from
  internet poker site(s) licensed to racing industry should flow only to entities who
  are active participants in the industry: horsemen (owners/breeders); tracks; Fairs
  (racing & satellites). If an entity elects to leave the racing industry or goes out of
  business, their previous distributions will be redistributed amongst those who
  continue an active role in the racing industry.
- Fairs will Invest New Revenues into Racing Facilities: CARF, acting on behalf of Fairs, will invest revenues from internet poker into racing facilities, satellite facilities and purse supplements. Fair poker distributions will be made to CARF for investment in racing and satellite facilities at Fairs or for supplemental purse distribution for Fair race meets. [Prior to elimination of Fair funding in the state budget, CARF managed annual investments of approx \$2.5 M for racing & satellite facility maintenance and upgrades. In addition, another \$1.5 M was distributed annually in supplemental purse funds (\$1.1 North & \$400K South). Total invested annually prior to budget elimination: \$4.0 Million]
- Fairs' Position on Distribution of Poker Revenues: Fairs take the position that the distribution formula for internet poker be based the formula presently used for simulcasting or ADW handle. This existing model includes distributions to horsemen, tracks/Fairs and to satellite facilities ("location fees").

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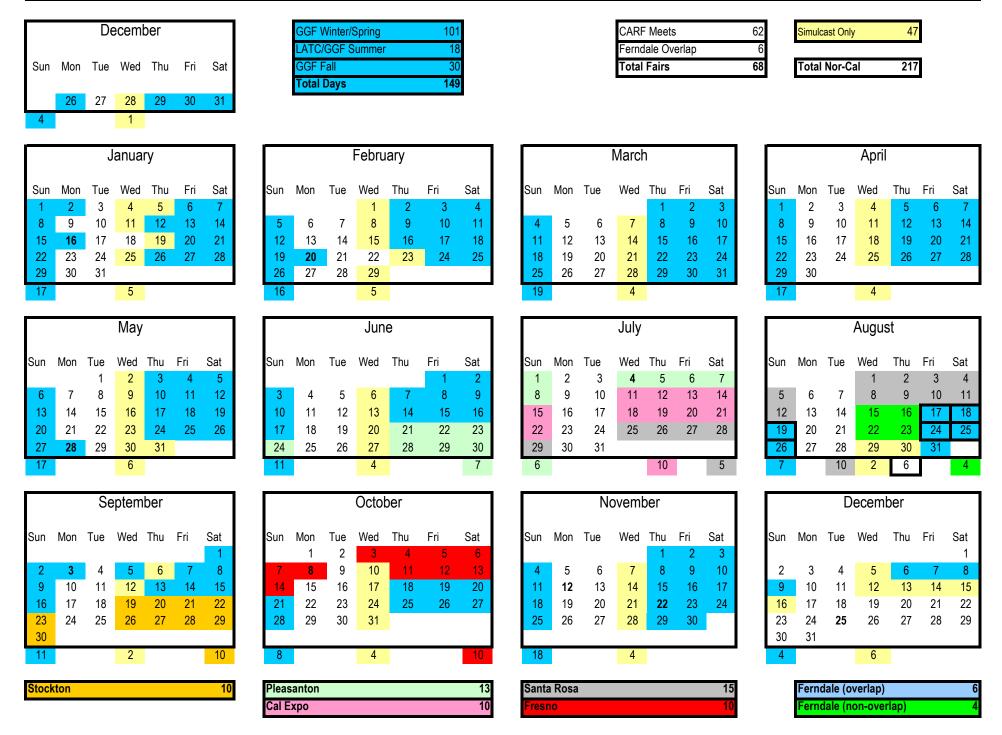

Update on discussions regarding Northern Cal Racing Dates in August 2012

#### Dear Chairman Brackpool,

You asked that California Authority of Racing Fairs (CARF) facilitate discussions between and amongst Humboldt County Fair (Humboldt), Golden Gate Fields (GGF) and Thoroughbred Owners of California (TOC) regarding Northern California racing dates in August 2012.

CARF has done so. Representatives of the parties have met twice to discuss this matter, once at GGF on Saturday October 22 and again in Sacramento on October 31, 2011. The parties have not been able to reach agreement.

Golden Gate Fields has proposed a modification to the position it proposed at the last CHRB meeting. This modification is favorable to Humboldt. Under GGF's modified proposal, GGF will agree that Humboldt would race solo and act as Host track on Friday August 17, 2012. GGF has also agreed that Humboldt would have Host status on Wednesday and Thursday for each of the two weeks that Humboldt has proposed to run in August.

Under this most recent GGF proposal, all Host commissions (100%) from Friday, August 17<sup>th</sup>, 2012, would flow to Humboldt. By comparison, in 2011 GGF and Humboldt shared commissions 50%/50% from one Friday. GGF stated that it could make no further concessions, citing lost revenues to the track and to horsemen as the reason. TOC concurred in this position.

GGF also added a condition for its offer regarding Friday August 17<sup>th</sup>: its condition is that 2012 would be the last year it would agree to concessions regarding August dates for Humboldt. In future years, GGF would recommend that Humboldt move to June or September. TOC also concurred in this position.

Under this proposal from GGF, Humboldt would act as Host track for five days: Wednesday August 15<sup>th</sup>, Thursday August 16<sup>th</sup>, Friday August 17<sup>th</sup>, Wednesday August 22<sup>nd</sup> and Thursday August 23<sup>rd</sup>.

Humboldt County Fair did not agree to this proposal from GGF. Humboldt stated that the reason that it could not agree to the GGF/TOC proposal "was because it would not meet required purses and commissions to conduct meet."

Humboldt maintained its original proposal for five continuous days of Host status in its first week and two days of Host status in its second week as follows: Host status and right to race solo on Wednesday August 15<sup>th</sup>, Thursday August 16<sup>th</sup>, Friday August 17<sup>th</sup>, Saturday August 18<sup>th</sup> and Sunday August 19<sup>th</sup> of its first week; then Host status and right to race solo on Wednesday August 22<sup>nd</sup> and Thursday August 23<sup>rd</sup> of its second week. Humboldt cited the necessity of generating a sufficient level of purses and commissions as the reason for maintaining this position.

Golden Gate Fields and TOC did not agree to this proposal.

We will continue working to seek agreement amongst the parties and will keep you apprised of any progress.
