## MINUTES

A meeting of the California Authority of Racing Fairs (CARF) Live Racing Committee was held at 11:00 A.M., Tuesday, March 4, 2014. The meeting was hosted at the CARF offices, 1776 Tribute Road, Sacramento, California.

CARF Live Racing Committee members attending: John Alkire, Richard Conway, Jerome Hoban, Brian May, Mike Paluszak and Rick Pickering.

Staff and Guests attending: Christopher Korby, Larry Swartzlander, Tom Doutrich, Heather Haviland, Amelia White, Raechelle Gibbons, Ann Grottveit, Chris Carpenter, Jeanne Wasserman, Sara Tasnady, Dennis Murphy, John Quiroz, Cindy Olsen, Jim Morgan, Allen Aldrich, Caroline Titus, Tawny Tesconi, Katie Young and Richard Lewis.

**Agenda Item 1 – Date, Time and Location of Next Meeting.** The next CARF Live Racing Committee meeting will be held Tuesday, April 1, 2014 in Sacramento.

Agenda Item 2 – Public Comment. None.

**Agenda Item 3 – Approval of Minutes.** Mr. Hoban moved to approve the meeting minutes as presented. Mr. Conway seconded, unanimously approved.

**Agenda Item 4 – Report, Discussion and Action, if any, on CARF 2014 Legislative Program.** Hearings involving several racing related bills required Mr. Brown's presence at the Capitol. Mr. Korby reported on AB 1303 which would allow Oak Tree to race at a Fair in Northern California.

**Agenda Item 5 – Presentation by Representatives of HRTV.** Dennis Murphy and Sara Tasnady presented the advertising proposals included in the meeting packet titled "California Authority of Racing Fairs – HRTV 2014 Race Promotion Package" and "HRTV Race Promotion Program Summary."

Agenda Item 6 – Report, Discussion and Action, if any, on Memorandum of Understanding for Monies Owed CARF by Member Fairs. Mr. Korby reported that CARF staff has requested that Humboldt County Fair sign a memorandum of understanding, similar to the document signed by the San Joaquin County Fair in 2013, which would give the agency assurance that monies extended on behalf of the Fair to conduct racing will be reimbursed in a timely manner in the event that the revenues generated from racing do not cover expenses. Furthermore, CARF staff would like written assurance that any purse overpayments will be met in the event that the Humboldt County Fair is no longer solvent.

Mr. Conway stated that 2013 invoices to CARF have been paid in a timely manner. Mr. Korby noted that there have been historical patterns of late payment by Humboldt County Fair to CARF, sometimes lagging by as much as a year. Since future commissions may no longer cover expenses, a MOU is necessary to protect the agency, thereby protecting member Fairs.

Mr. Morgan discussed Humboldt County Fair's financial situation as a result of running in an overlap situation with Golden Gate Fields. Mr. Morgan stated that the MOU submitted to Humboldt County Fair for review has a typo regarding the Fair name.

Mr. Morgan circulated a letter he wrote to Ms. Grottveit dated March 3, 2014 regarding CARF's position on overlapping race dates and a request for improved CARF advocacy with the CHRB. Mr. Korby stated that each time a letter like this is written and circulated throughout the racing industry it undoes much of the hard work and progress that is made to address the issue overlapping race dates.

Mr. Conway requested to meet with CARF staff to further discuss racing expenses and the draft MOU.

Mr. Alkire stated that to protect the agency and member Fairs from potential liability, he would vote to require an MOU between the Humboldt County Fair and CARF for the payment of monies owed CARF.

Mr. Pickering provided historical background on prior concerns by the CARF Board about financial matters related to racing at the Humboldt County Fair. Mr. Pickering stated that he is encouraged that the parties seem willing to work towards a sensible solution. Mr. Pickering asked which representative from Humboldt County Fair would be responsible for negotiating the details of the MOU with CARF staff. Mr. Conway indicated that he would be representing Humboldt County Fair in CARF matters.

Mr. Hoban stated that there is already an implied commitment that each Fair will meet its monetary obligations to CARF and he is in favor of all member Fairs solidifying that position with a written MOU. Mr. Hoban volunteered to be part of the dialog to move forward an MOU for monies owned CARF by all member Fairs. Mr. Hoban stated that CARF members are stronger as a unit and he is in favor of presenting a united front on topics such as overlap to the extent that it is practical.

Mr. May stated that, as a representative of San Joaquin Fair which signed the existing MOU template, he is in favor of the concept. Mr. May stated that he and Mr. Korby worked hard to reach the MOU language as it is currently written and feels that it is a balanced agreement.

Mr. Paluszak stated that the MOU language has come a long way since the concept was first presented to the CARF Board. Mr. Paluszak feels that the current draft is an agreement that all Fairs should enter into as a good business decision.

Mr. Alkire requested that Mr. Korby continue discussions with Mr. Conway and others within the next 30 days and present the CARF Live Racing Committee with signed MOU's.

Ms. Grottveit stated that legal counsel recommends that a MOU for monies owned by member Fairs to CARF be put into place with all racing Fairs. Ms. Grottveit stated that Mr. Korby and Mr. May have done a fine job reworking the original MOU into a manageable document and signing this document protects and preserves the agency to the benefit of all participants.

Mr. Hoban moved to require individual racing Fairs to sign a memorandum of understanding for monies owed CARF from the hard costs associated with running a race meet. Mr. Pickering seconded, unanimously approved.

Mr. Hoban requested that CARF consider developing pro forma financial statements for each Fair prior to the next budget cycle to help Fairs understand the true financial impact of racing expenses. Mr. May stated that CARF staff provided Stockton with something similar in 2013 and it was very productive. Mr. Korby agreed that CARF would provide a pro forma for each Fair for the next budget cycle.

**Agenda Item 7 – Report, Discussion and Action, if any, on CARF Consolidated Purse Account.** Mr. Korby stated that there was nothing additional to report. Mr. Alkire stated that maintaining unity in regards to upholding and protecting the consolidated purse fund is of paramount importance.

Agenda Item 8 – Discussion and Action, if any, on Specific Racing Days per Week at Fairs in 2014. Mr. Korby asked if any Fair has plans to run days different than the 2013 schedule, excluding adjustments predicated by changes in how the 2014 calendar falls. Mr. Korby reported that staff will be working with Humboldt County Fair to provide a schedule recommendation that comports with the Fair's financial situation and purse structure to offer a financially responsible racing program that is tailored to provide the best quality racing possible.

**Agenda Item 9 – Discussion and Action, if any, on Planning for 2014 Fair Racing Circuit.** Mr. Swartzlander reported that all contracts are current with the exception of Disher Accountancy and all of the horsemen's agreements are expected to be formally approved. Mr. Doutrich provided an update on the status of racing at Northern and Southern California associations.

**Agenda Item 10 – Discussion and Action, if any, on CHRB Racing License Application.** Mr. Swartzlander reported that the draft application for Pleasanton has been prepared and the application process is proceeding smoothly.

Agenda Item 11 – Report, Discussion and Action, if any, on Racing Days for 2014, 2015 and Beyond. Mr. Korby stated that this item was placed on the agenda for discussion of any current matters regarding 2014 and 2015 race dates. Mr. Korby reported that the matter of Northern California 2015 race dates was put over by the CHRB Board at the last meeting and there is nothing new to report at this time.

Mr. Morgan asked for CARF's position regarding the multiple calendars circulating for August 2015 race dates. Mr. Korby stated that CARF was not supporting a specific calendar and that discussions are still active amongst industry principals. Mr. Conway stated that regardless of whether Cal Expo is granted two weeks or three weeks, Humboldt County Fair should at least request their first week be granted unopposed. Mr. Conway stated that he would understand if the request was denied, but felt it was important to at least try. Mr. Korby agreed that with the disproportionate allocation of dates to Golden Gate Fields, requesting a week of unoverlapped racing at Ferndale is not unreasonable, though there will be significant opposition from horsemen.

Mr. Pickering announced that Cal Expo has entered into an agreement with Ovations Fanfare LLC to create a multi-use sports field facility. Approximately \$3 million will be spent to construct the project and it will be built on land adjacent to Raging Waters. The facility will not interfere with horse racing and will instead offer a unique opportunity to cross promote horse racing, soccer and rugby.

Mr. Pickering reported that Cal Expo is working with the State Fire Marshall to have plans approved to modify the barn area to accommodate both air conditioners and fire escapes, thereby alleviating concerns that disrupted horsemen in 2013.

Mr. Pickering reported that the harness meet at Cal Expo has handled several \$1 million days recently and that between Thoroughbred and Standardbred racing, Cal Expo represents 19% of horse racing starts in California.

**Agenda Item 12 – Executive Director's Report.** Mr. Korby reported that staff is in discussions with Oak Tree Racing Association as a participating association in our racing circuit. Oak Tree may race at the Alameda County Fair during their three weeks of racing. That scenario will be built into our purse structure and in negotiations with horsemen's groups.

Mr. Korby reported that Martin Panza, former Vice President of Racing and Racing Secretary at Hollywood Park, was hired by the New York Racing Association (NYRA) as Senior Vice President of Racing Operations. Martin Panza was recently in Southern California on a recruiting trip to entice horsemen to New York, signifying the important role recruitment is playing in major racing associations.

**Summary:** Existing law, the Horse Racing Law, notwithstanding any other law, authorizes fairs that conduct live horse racing meetings in the northern zone to allow a joint powers authority to administer and distribute purses and authorizes the California Horse Racing Board to annually allocate a maximum of 28 racing days to any county fair in the northern zone which did not conduct horse racing prior to January 1, 1985. This bill would authorize the board, notwithstanding any other law, to allocate racing days to a fair in the northern zone to be conducted by the fair or, at the request of the fair, to authorize the board to license a racing association that was licensed by the board to conduct racing meetings in California prior to 2010 to conduct live horse racing days, whether they are conducted by the fair or the racing association contracting with the fair, to be subject to the same provisions of law as are presently applicable to a fair race meeting in the northern zone. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

Summary: Existing law creates in the State Treasury the Indian Gaming Special Distribution Fund for the receipt and deposit of moneys received by the state from certain Indian tribes pursuant to the terms of gaming compacts entered into with the state. Existing law authorizes moneys in that fund to be used for specified purposes, including for grants for the support of state and local government agencies impacted by tribal government gaming. Existing law, until January 1, 2021, creates a County Tribal Casino Account in the treasury of each county that contains a tribal casino, which is funded according to specified formulas. Existing law requires the Controller to divide the County Tribal Casino Account for each county that has gaming devices that are subject to an obligation to make contributions to the Indian Gaming Special Distribution Fund into a separate account, known as an Individual Tribal Casino Account, for each tribe that operates a casino within the county. Each Individual Tribal Casino Account is required to be funded in proportion to the amount that each individual tribe paid in the prior fiscal year to the Indian Gaming Special Distribution Fund, and used for grants to local agencies impacted by tribal casinos, as specified. Existing law establishes an Indian Gaming Local Community Benefit Committee in each county in which gaming is conducted, specifies the composition and responsibilities of that committee, and requires that committee to make the selection of grants from the casino accounts. Among other things, the committee is responsible for establishing all application policies and procedures for grants from the casino accounts. This bill would delete the obsolete provisions relating to allocations made in those specified fiscal years. This bill contains other existing laws.

Summary: The Gambling Control Act provides for the licensure of certain individuals and establishments that conduct controlled games, as defined, and for the regulation of these gambling activities by the California Gambling Control Commission. The Department of Justice has related investigatory and enforcement duties under the act. Any violation of these provisions is punishable as a misdemeanor, as specified. This bill would establish a framework to authorize intrastate Internet poker, as specified. The bill would authorize eligible entities to apply to the commission for a 10-year nontransferable license to operate an intrastate Internet poker Web site offering the play of authorized Internet poker games to registered players within California, as specified. The bill would require that the license be automatically renewed every 10 years upon application, as specified. The bill would prohibit the offer or play of any gambling game provided over the Internet that is not an authorized Internet poker game permitted by the state pursuant to this bill. The bill would prohibit, among others, a federally recognized California Indian tribe that operates a gaming facility that accepts bets from players within the state but who are not physically present on Indian lands when making bets from operating an Internet poker Web site. The bill also would provide that it is unlawful for a person to patronize, or to own or operate, a place of public accommodation within this state in which computer terminals, laptop computers, hand-held devices, or similar devices are made available for accessing Internet Web sites to play gambling games, or where those devices are otherwise empowered or enabled to access Internet Web sites to play gambling games. The bill would provide that it is unlawful for a person to aggregate computers or other access devices in a public setting within this state for the purpose of playing a gambling game on the Internet, or to promote, facilitate, or market that activity. The bill would provide that any violation of these provisions is punishable as a misdemeanor. By creating new crimes, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

**Summary:** Existing law authorizes a thoroughbred racing association or fair to distribute the audiovisual signal and accept wagers on the results of out-of-state thoroughbred races conducted in the United States during the calendar period the association or fair is conducting a race meeting, including days on which there is no live racing being conducted by the association or fair, without the consent of the organization that represents horsemen and horsewomen participating in the race meeting and without regard to the amount of purses. Under existing law, the total number of thoroughbred races imported by associations or fairs on a statewide basis under these provisions shall not exceed 50 per day on days when live thoroughbred or fair racing is being conducted in the state, with the exception of prescribed races, including races imported that are part of the race card of the Kentucky Derby, the Kentucky Oaks, the Preakness Stakes, the Belmont Stakes, the Jockey Club Gold Cup, the Travers Stakes, the Arlington Million, the Breeders' Cup, the Dubai Cup, the Arkansas Derby, or the Haskell Invitational. This bill would exempt from the 50 imported race per day limitation, races imported that are part of the race card of the Apple Blossom Handicap.

**Summary:** Until January 1, 2014, the provisions of the Horse Racing Law required a thoroughbred racing association and fair that conducts a racing meeting to deduct a percentage of the total amount handled in exotic parimutuel pools of thoroughbred racing, to be distributed to a specified organization for the purpose of defraying costs of workers' compensation insurance in connection with thoroughbred horse racing. Until January 1, 2014, provisions of the Horse Racing Law authorized similar deductions from the total amount handled for races for quarter horses and other breeds, and for harness races, to be distributed to specified organizations for defraying workers' compensation for trainers and owners in connection with those races. This bill would reestablish those provisions requiring the deduction specified above to be made by a thoroughbred racing association, and would reestablish those provisions authorizing the deductions to be made for races for quarter horses and other brees and other breeds, and for harness races. Because a violation of the Horse Racing Law is generally a misdemeanor, the bill would create new crimes, thereby imposing a state-mandated local program. This bill contains other related provisions and other existing laws.

**Summary:** The Gambling Control Act provides for the licensure of certain individuals and establishments involved in various gambling activities, and for the regulation of those activities, by the California Gambling Control Commission, and defines a gambling enterprise for these purposes. Existing law requires a contract for the sale of a gambling enterprise to state whether any outstanding gaming chips from the seller will be honored by the purchaser. Prior to any action of the commission on the proposed contract for sale of the gambling enterprise, existing law requires the Department of Justice to determine the amount of the seller's outstanding gaming chip liability, and requires the seller to satisfy the commission that the amount of liability is safeguarded by a form of security sufficient to satisfy the redemption of outstanding gaming chips. This bill would make

technical, nonsubstantive changes to this provision.

## **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

THIS WILL CONSTITUTE A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) BETWEEN THE \_\_\_\_\_\_FAIR ("FAIR") AND THE CALIFORNIA AUTHORITY OF RACING FAIRS (CARF)

WHEREAS, by way of the Amended and Restated Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement, executed July 7, 1989 ("JPA"), CARF provides necessary services to the \_\_\_\_\_\_\_Fair (hereinafter "FAIR"), by contract or otherwise which may include, but is not limited to, centralized government affairs representation; reports and analysis of the horse racing industry; administration of joint services of CARF including planning, budget implementation and fund accounting; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the JPA, CARF shall provide to the FAIR the services outlined and agreed to in Exhibit "A", attached to and made part of this MOU for the live racing meeting to be held at the FAIR in 2014 ("2014 FAIR race meet"); and

WHEREAS, the FAIR desires that CARF, on behalf of the FAIR, underwrite the racing expenses associated with the services outlined and agreed to in Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the JPA, CARF is responsible for the collection and distribution of the off track pari-mutuel commissions on behalf of its member Fairs which conduct live racing.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants set forth herein,

1)

CARF shall provide the services outlined in Exhibit "A".

2)

The FAIR agrees that CARF shall deduct from intrastate, interstate and international parimutuel commissions the monies owed to CARF by the FAIR for the racing expenses associated with the services outlined and agreed to in Exhibit "A". It is contemplated that the balance of the commissions shall be paid in the same manner as paid out in 2013 to the FAIR with a pro-rata reduction which reflects any reduction in racing dates between 2013 to and 2014 as noted in Exhibit B.

3)

The term of this MOU shall be for the 2014 FAIR race meet and shall renew thereafter unless terminated in writing by either party on or before March 1 of subsequent years.

4)

In the event that FAIR racing revenues are not sufficient to cover expenses incurred by CARF on behalf of FAIR, FAIR agrees to pay the amount of the shortfall to CARF.

## SUMMARY OF CHRB ACTIONS AND DISCUSSIONS 3-21-14

SACRAMENTO, CA – The California Horse Racing Board conducted its regular meeting Friday, March 21, 2014, at Cal Expo. Chairman Chuck Winner presided. 1<sup>st</sup> Vice Chair Bo Derek, 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice Chair Richard Rosenberg, and Commissioners Madeline Auerbach, Steve Beneto, Jesse Choper, and George Krikorian were in attendance.

The audio of this entire Board meeting is available on the CHRB Website (<u>www.chrb.ca.gov</u>) under the <u>Webcast</u> link. In brief:

• The Board finalized the Northern California racing calendar for 2015 by allocating racing dates for the latter half of the year to Golden Gate Fields and the northern fairs. The Board earlier approved the racing calendar for the first half of 2015 by allocating dates for the current meet at Golden Gate Fields through June 15.


The racing season will continue with dates allocated to the Alameda County Fair in Pleasanton (June 17 through July 6) followed by the State Fair at Cal Expo (July 9 through July 26), the Sonoma County Fair in Santa Rosa (July 30 through August 16), the Humboldt County Fair in Ferndale (August 19 through August 30) and somewhat concurrently at Golden Gate Fields (August 21through September 13), the San Joaquin County Fair in Stockton (September 18 through September 27), the Big Fresno Fair in Fresno (October 1 through October 12), and finally at Golden Gate (October 15 through December 20). The various locations will designate their precise racing dates within these block allocations when each submits its license application three months before the start of its meet.

- The Board approved for 45-day public notice a proposed regulatory amendment to require that authorized bleeder medication be administered by independent, third-party veterinarians along with a requirement for a prescription for furosemide (Lasix).
- Commissioner Auerbach reported that the newly designed stakes schedules in Southern California following the closure of Hollywood Park will include all stakes races historically run in Southern California.

- The Board agreed to write a letter to California Insurance Commissioner Dave Jones urging him to find a resolution to a newly raised problem with underwriting for catastrophic injury insurance for California jockeys. This policy is in addition to workers' compensation insurance that continues to cover all jockeys and fully pays for all medical expenses relating to a work-related accident.
- The Board voted to support Senate Concurrent Resolution 95, which would designate the race track at Cal Expo as the Kirk Breed Memorial Race Track, honoring the late Kirk Breed, who served as general manager of Cal Expo and also on its Board of Directors before being named CHRB executive director.
- The Department of Finance reported on an ongoing operational audit of the CHRB, prompted by a reorganization of state government last year that placed the CHRB within the Business, Consumer Services and Housing Agency.
- The Board approved for 45-day public notice a proposed regulator amendment to delete from the license application the requirement for synthetic surfaces and to require the past two years of stakes schedules, a listing of pari-mutuel takeout rates, and the names and working schedules of racing veterinarians.

## **INTRODUCTION**

▶ In 2001, CARF developed a program to actively recruit out-ofstate owners, trainers and horses to compete on the Northern California Summer Racing Circuit. The goal of the program was simple: increase the field size for summer racing in Northern California.

In order to accomplish this goal, CARF set three objectives for the initial program: 1) inform and educate horsemen in other jurisdictions about the benefits of racing in California, 2) retain horsemen who have elected to compete in Northern California in previous years, and 3) offer financial incentives to assist horsemen with the cost of shipping horses to Northern California.

The CARF recruitment program proved successful in bringing horsemen to California and increasing field size. From 2001 to 2012, the CARF recruitment program paid more than \$431,000 in shipping incentives to horses that made upwards of 3,700 starts.

The landscape of racing in California has changed dramatically since the recruitment program's inception in 2001. We're finding that retention and recognition of horsemen have become just as important as recruitment. Consequently, we're adjusting the incentives in our program so that the elements of *recruitment*, *retention* and *recognition* will each contribute to the program's primary objective: increase field size.

We're pleased to report that the changes to our program in 2013 were met with positive response from horsemen. Once again this year, the program proved itself to be a successful component of our summer racing in Northern California.

In closing, we want to express our sincere thanks to all the owners and trainers who participated in our meets this last year and extend a cordial invitation to join us again in 2014.

# **OUR STRATEGY**

The 2013 CARF Recruitment Program was expanded to include recruitment, starter incentives and a VIP Horsemen's program.

## RECRUITMENT OUT-OF-STATE SHIPPING INCENTIVES

CARF paid \$45,900 in relocation fees to 129 horses which made 282 starts on the 2013 Fair Circuit.

• Each spring since 2001, CARF has scheduled a series of out-of-state recruitment visits to personally meet one-on-one with horsemen in other jurisdictions and invite them to complete in Northern California for the summer.

To give extra meaning to our invitation and to financially assist horsemen who choose to ship to our circuit, CARF pays a \$300 Relocation Fee to the designated payee of any horse making its first start after shipping over 600 miles. A qualifying runner making its second start on the Fair Circuit will receive \$150.

## RETENTION STARTER INCENTIVES & FIELD SIZE

## **RECOGNITION** HORSEMEN VIP PROGRAM

▶ The CARF VIP Horsemen's Program provides horsemen with a single set of parking and admission credentials for the CARF Fair Circuit. The VIP Horsemen database is also used to distribute a welcome packet of information prior to the Fairs and fuel cards that are redeemable through the Paymaster's office.

# **PROGRAM BUDGET**

• The CARF Recruitment Program is funded by allocations from member Fairs and from the California Marketing Committee (CMC).

In 2013, staff decided to forego the traditional outof-state recruitment trips, receptions and dinners in favor of a direct mail piece to our database of out-of-state horsemen developed over the past 12 years during trips to Arizona, Oregon, Idaho and Washington.

Funds that normally would have been allocated for recruitment trips were instead redirected to develop a new Starter Incentive Program. This program was developed to retain Northern California trainers and increase field size at Fairs that require horsemen to ship outside of the Bay Area.

# **RECRUITMENT RESULTS**


▶ The CARF Out-of-State Recruitment Program, administered by the California Authority of Racing Fairs staff, makes available \$300 to every horse that travels 600 miles or more to start on the Northern California Fair Circuit for its first start and \$150 for its second start (\$450 total). A runner making its first start at Ferndale receives \$150 for each of two starts, with another \$150 available if the horse starts again at Stockton and/or Fresno.

During recruiting efforts prior to our first meet, horsemen are notified of the program and invited to visit or call the paymaster when running an out-of-state horse. The paymaster maintains a ledger of eligible horses and verifies by past performances or Coggins test paperwork that the horse has traveled 600 miles or more to run on the Fairs. Payment is made by a transfer into the account of the owner or trainer of the horse.



## Recruitment by State





# **RETENTION RESULTS**

In an effort to retain Northern California trainers, maximize field size and offset the cost of shipping outside of the Bay Area, CARF offered a \$1,000 incentive for trainers making 10 or more starts at select Fairs (Cal Expo, Stockton and Fresno). Trainers making 5-9 starts received a \$500 bonus. This program realized a 49% increase in the number of entries made by qualifying trainers and a 46% increase in the number of starts.

## CAL EXPO - 34 TRAINERS QUALIFIED FOR THE STARTER INCENTIVE PROGRAM.

Entries by these trainers were up 37% (336 in 2012 compared to 460 in 2013) and starts were up 42% (183 in 2012 compared to 259 in 2013). Thoroughbred field size for the meet increased from 6.73 in 2012 to 7.24 in 2013.






## STOCKTON - 19 TRAINERS QUALIFIED FOR THE STARTER INCENTIVE PROGRAM.

With two days less racing, entries by these trainers were up 64% (140 in 2012 compared to 229 in 2013) and starts were up 56% (82 in 2012 compared to 128 in 2013). Thoroughbred field size for the meet increased from 6.92 in 2012 to 8.19 in 2013.

## FRESNO - 32 TRAINERS QUALIFIED FOR THE STARTER INCENTIVE PROGRAM.

Entries by these trainers were up 54% (336 in 2012 compared to 518 in 2013) and starts were up 46% (192 in 2012 compared to 281 in 2013).


