MINUTES

A teleconference meeting of the California Authority of Racing Fairs (CARF) Board of Directors was held at 12:30 P.M., Tuesday, April 7, 2015. The teleconference meeting was hosted at the CARF offices, 1776 Tribute Road, Sacramento, California.

CARF Board Directors attending: John Alkire, Jerome Hoban and Rick Pickering. Joining by teleconference: Chris Borovansky and Kelly Violini.

Staff and Guests attending: Christopher Korby, Larry Swartzlander, Tom Doutrich, Heather Haviland, Juliana Gomes, Raechelle Gibbons, Brian May, Richard Conway, Allen Aldrich, Jim Morgan and Richard Lewis. Joining by teleconference: Louie Brown and Stephen Pierce.

Agenda Item 1 – Date, Time and Location of Next Meeting: May 5, 2015. The next CARF Board of Directors meeting will be held Tuesday, May 5, 2015 in Sacramento.

Agenda Item 2 – Public Comment. On behalf of the CARF Board of Directors and staff, Mr. Alkire congratulated Louie Brown on being named an equity partner in Kahn, Soares and Conway, LLP.

Agenda Item 3 – Approval of Minutes. Mr. Pickering moved to approve the meeting minutes as presented. Mr. Hoban seconded, unanimously approved.

Agenda Item 4 – Report, Discussion and Action, if any, on CARF 2015 Legislative Program. Mr. Brown reported that the Legislature reconvened from spring recess on April 6, making this the first week of serious policy committee hearings prior to the May 1 deadline for policy committees to refer bills to fiscal committees. Legislation regarding industry-specific racing bills is light, with most bills on the legislative report being spot bills. Legislative staff is working closely with Assemblyman Henry Perea on AB 650 as a placeholder for racing fairs should policy changes be required during the session.

Mr. Brown reported that Internet poker is still a leading issue at the Capitol. The two outstanding policy points hampering forward movement are the bad-actor clause (i.e. Poker Stars) and the participation of the horse racing industry. Poker Stars has an agreement in principle with a group of tribes in Northern California and has the technological framework and

operational expertise in place to get a site up and running quickly. Recent meetings suggest that the bad-actor clause may be resolved soon, which would leave racing participation as the outstanding issue. Racing principals themselves do not have a cohesive plan for the industry as a whole. The Stronach Group, Del Mar and the horsemen's organizations would like the opportunity to obtain a license, which is heavily opposed by some in the tribal community, while other tribal and racing interests favor mitigation. Mr. Brown will reach out to racing lobbyists this week to better determine how racing fairs would like to fit in the overall structure of Internet poker legislation and if a consensus within the industry can be reached and placed in writing.

Mr. Brown reported that Governor Jerry Brown's proposed 2015-2016 state budget, which includes \$3 million to assist with fair operations and a \$7 million one-time allocation for deferred maintenance at fairs, passed the Assembly Budget Subcommittee on a unanimous vote and will be heard in the Senate Budget Subcommittee later this month. Mr. Korby stated that if fair funding is signed into the 2015-16 budget, racing fairs will seek consideration for funding from monies generated at racing fairs, in the form of license fees, which are presently directed to F&E.

Mr. Borovansky asked if the card room lobbyists have a public position regarding Internet poker. Mr. Brown stated that all of the bills introduced thus far include card rooms as an entity eligible for a license.

Agenda Item 5 – Discussion and Action, if any, on Proposal Made to NCOTWINC Regarding Potential Simulcast Network Expansion. Mr. Korby reported that the meeting packets contain a proposal from TOC to NCTOWINC titled *Proposed Resolutions Regarding the Testing of a Different Economic Model for Northern California Satellites*. Previously, industry principals had discussed exploring the possibility of fair satellites agreeing to reduce the existing exclusivity radius around fair sites in exchange for an increase in fair satellite commissions. The proposal was considered by the CARF Finance Committee and rejected due to the lack of parity when compared to mini-satellite development and the overall lack of benefits compared to the proposed requirements.

Mr. Borovansky moved to oppose the proposal from TOC titled *Proposed Resolutions Regarding the Testing of a Different Economic Model for Northern California Satellites*, with direction to CARF staff to continue negotiations with industry principals. Mr. Hoban seconded, unanimously approved.

Agenda Item 6 – Report, Discussion and Action, if any, on Racing Dates for 2016 and Beyond. Mr. Korby reported that the CARF Live Racing Committee took action to request a block of races dates from June 22 through October 16, 2016, with details to be determined as the group continues discussions.

Agenda Item 7 – Financials. Mr. Alkire stated that financials are included in the meeting packet and that Ms. Gibbons is available to answer questions.

Agenda Item 8 – Executive Director’s Report. No report.

Golden Gate Threatens Closure at CHRB Session

A California Horse Racing Board discussion regarding the reallocation of 2015 racing dates for the California Fair circuit often shifted to the possibility of [Golden Gate Fields](#) closing in the future.

During an argument between representatives of The Stronach Group and members of the California Authority of Racing Fairs April 15, Keith Brackpool, the chairman of West Coast operations for The Stronach Group—which owns the track—made the first reference to the potential sale of the site on the shores of the San Francisco Bay.

"We intend, over the coming weeks, to put forth a proposal as to what it would take for us to stay in business here at Golden Gate," Brackpool said in front of the CHRB. "That proposal will include a proposed racing calendar. It will include potential overlaps in the racing calendar. But if we can't come to

agreement on what that is and have the security, then we will have no other alternative but to close the facility.

"The redevelopment options here are quite extraordinary... The upside is very, very significant and we have offers that are stratospheric."

The two sides, in essentially a public negotiation, eventually agreed in principle to adjust the racing 2015 racing calendar—with Golden Gate ending its August-September meet Sept. 7, followed by the San Joaquin County Fair conducting meets in Stockton, Calif. for two weeks, leading into another two-week meet for Golden Gate, which would then lead into Fresno's fair dates beginning Oct. 8. But Brackpool consistently contended that Stockton should not be allowed to have racing, because it doesn't conduct a true "fair."

Thoroughbred Owners of California president Joe Morris agreed with Brackpool's assertion.

"TOC has been very consistent on this point over the last couple of years," Morris said, "We don't think race dates should go to fairs that don't run (fairs). We've been saying that on record in the two years I've been here and we've continued to say that."

San Joaquin County Fair representatives said they would put on "fair-like events" during the meet and CHRB commissioner Steve Beneto vehemently disagreed with the notion of cancelling Stockton's racing dates.

"We're not going to kill any more fairs," Beneto said.

But Brackpool continued to criticize the system, which he feels directly impacts Golden Gate's bottom line, and hinted at a proposal, coming at a later date, that would change the structure of Northern California's racing schedule.

"You won't find a race calendar like this anywhere in the country—open two weeks, close two weeks, reopen for two weeks," Brackpool said. "It doesn't work. That's why we're coming forth with something radically different. This

model is broken beyond repair. This is nothing but a subsidy to the fairs. That's all this model is—broken beyond repair. It makes absolutely no sense at all... It's absurd. We will go with it for this year, but we won't go with this on an ongoing basis. It doesn't make any sense."

Another Stronach Group representative, Scott Daruty, also explicitly mentioned potentially closing Golden Gate, which sits on the border of Bay Area cities Albany and Berkeley.

"It feels like the solution is to always take (racing dates) from Golden Gate... It's an expensive facility to maintain and it's an expensive business to run," Daruty said. "We're not making any money, so we've got to figure out a way to keep this industry viable long term... We would certainly hope to avoid (closing Golden Gate). That's the hope and that's the goal we're working toward... There are astronomical property values and there are challenges in developing this property, but those challenges could be overcome, eventually."

"Is that what we want to do? No... (But) what we can't do is have multi-million dollar losses every year. That won't work. We'd like to come forward with a proposal to right the ship and we can all move on to the future. Will the fairs be part of that? Of course they will, in some shape or form. But will it be identical, in our opinion, to what it's been in the past? Probably not."

California Authority of Racing Fairs executive director Christopher Korby said the CARF would not want Golden Gate to close, but also acknowledged the Northern California fair locations could be in a position to absorb the dates should Golden Gate end racing.

"We're not advocating that, but we'll step up if that's what the reality becomes," Korby said.

The Stronach Group announced April 23 that senior vice president Tom Ludt has been appointed to spearhead a key company initiative, the purpose of which The Stronach Group is expected to reveal at a later date. Effective immediately, Ludt will assume control of the creation and implementation of the new national project under development within the company.

As president of [Santa Anita Park](#), Ludt oversaw a successful 68-day winter meeting, which concluded April 19. In a meet that opened Dec. 26, the track posted a 3% year-over-year increase in overall pari-mutuel handle and a 4% year-over-year hike in on-track attendance.

As a result of his new appointment, Ludt will no longer oversee the day-to-day operations at Santa Anita. Keith Brackpool, chairman of The Stronach Group's West Coast operations, will assume control of Santa Anita's day-to-day management, effective opening day of the track's spring meeting, which begins April 24.

"We very much appreciate Tom's stewardship of the Santa Anita Park operations over the past two years and we have now asked him to focus his talents on an important new project that we plan to roll out in the coming months," Brackpool said.
