#### Chris:

Pursuant to my earlier discussions with CARF's Board of Directors and Live Racing Committee, please accept the following as my initial request for reconsidering the allocation of costs for services provided by the authority to its member live racing fairs.

First, beginning with the 2008 racing season, the Humboldt County Fair Association will not be in a position to participate in the following services: Racetrack Chaplaincy and NTRA.

As time and circumstances permit, I'm requesting that a variety of expenses currently shared by member live racing fairs on a per race day basis, instead be considered on a per race basis. Those expenses include the following:

- MOC Accident & Health Insurance
  - Recruitment
  - Paymaster salary & benefits
  - Racing Intern
  - Announcer
  - Morning Line Maker
  - Network Manager Salary, & benefits
  - Simulcast Coordinator Salary & benefits
  - Pegasus Communications

I am hopeful that reasonable discussion may occur regarding this request and that alternative solutions can be discussed. Perhaps one way to look at the structure of costs would be to establish some sort of baseline set-up fee applicable to all, then spreading the remaining cost on a per race (or total race) basis.

That's it in a nutshell. I would like to have this item place on the next agenda for discussion.








### BetJet™ AB

### 2007 OUT-OF-STATE RECRUITMENT PROGRAM

#### **SUMMARY**

### **GOALS AND OBJECTIVES**

Since 2001, the California Authority of Racing Fairs (CARF) has conducted a program to actively recruit out-of-state owners, trainers and horses to compete on the Northern California Summer Racing Circuit. The goal of the program is simple: increase the field size for summer racing in Northern California. In order to accomplish this goal, CARF has set three objectives for the program: 1) inform and educate horsemen in other jurisdictions to the benefits of racing in California; 2) retain horsemen who have elected to compete in Northern California in previous years; and 3) offer financial incentives to assist horsemen with the cost of shipping horses to Northern California.

#### RECRUITMENT VISITS OUT-OF-STATE

Each spring CARF schedules a series of out-of-state recruitment visits in order to 1) personally meet one-on-one with horsemen in other jurisdictions; 2) explain the benefits of our program; and 3) invite them to compete in Northern California for the summer. In 2007, these visits included two trips to Arizona, a total of four days, with a reception at Turf Paradise and a three-day stay at Portland Meadows in Oregon, where we also sponsored a reception. These visits allow CARF management to respond personally and directly to questions or concerns about such matters as workmen's compensation, backstretch labor inspections and purse structures. In addition to the receptions and the personal visits with horsemen, CARF distributes an extensive packet of information to educate and inform horsemen about current issues of interest in California. By word of mouth, information about the program has also reached horsemen in Iowa, Idaho, New Mexico, Utah and Washington.

### **RELOCATION FEES**

In order to financially assist horsemen who choose to ship horses to our circuit, in 2007 CARF paid a \$300 Relocation Fee to the owner of any horse shipping into Northern California from over 600 miles away. A runner making its first start at Ferndale will receive \$150 at Ferndale and another \$150 if they also start at Fresno. Our Paymaster deposits the fee into the owner's account the first time that an eligible horse starts in a race on our circuit. The Relocation Fee gives some extra meaning to our invitation to come to California. In some cases, the incentive may create the tipping point as an owner or trainer decides about shipping to our circuit. The Relocation Fee also creates a Paymaster record that allows us to accurately track the results of our program from year to year.











 Field size is a problem in California. Without horses recruited from out-of-state, the average Thoroughbred field size on the Fair circuit would be smaller. The trend closely resembles the average field size of the Bay Meadows spring meet (6.98), which runs just before the Fair.

#### **Examples:**

Recruitment efforts brought 92 out-of-state starters to the Solano County Fair. Without those starters, the average Thoroughbred field size at the Vallejo would have dropped from 8.0 to 7.0. This trend continued at the California State Fair where the average Thoroughbred field size was 7.6. Without out-of-state starters, the average field size would have been 6.5.

An act to amend Section 19616.51 of the Business and Professions Code, relating to horse racing.

#### LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 2258, as introduced, Evans. Horse racing: license fees: shortfalls: pro rata assessment.

Existing law, the Horse Racing Law, provides that if the total amount paid to the state by racing associations and fairs is less than \$40,000,000 in any calendar year, all associations and fairs that conducted live racing during the year of the shortfall are required to remit certain amounts, on a pro rata basis, in order to attain that \$40,000,000 total.

This bill would make clarifying and technical changes to this provision.

### THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Section 19616.51 of the Business and Professions Code is amended to read:

19616.51. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, if the total amount paid to the state by racing associations and fairs pursuant to this chapter is less than forty million dollars (\$40,000,000) in any calendar year, beginning January 1, 2001, and thereafter, all associations and fairs that conducted live racing during the year of the shortfall shall remit to the state, on a pro rata basis according to the total amount handled in-state by each association or fair, the amount necessary to bring the total amount paid to the state to forty million dollars (\$40,000,000). The amounts due under this section, if any, shall be paid from the amount available for commissions, purses, and breeder awards, and shall be paid to the board prior to March 1 of the year following the year of the shortfall.

During a 15-minute question-and-answer period that featured callers being cut off from fc comments, an analyst expressed in a self-described "rant" his disappointment with the performance of the company.

"I really think you guys ought to go back and listen to about the last seven to eight confer calls, because it's like Groundhog Day," said Tim Rice of Rice-Voelker LLC. "Every quarter, results are disappointing; every quarter, we are going to sell assets and reduce debt. And ever happens."

Another caller requested an update on the search for a new CEO. Stronach has been servi interim CEO since Michael Neuman's departure from the position last March after a four-m stint. The company has had five CEOs since it was launched in 2000, with Stronach filling interim basis three separate times.

Stronach responded to the caller by saying new chief operating officer Ron Charles and for CEO Tom Hodgson, who has been retained by the company as a consultant, were taking c broader responsibilities. And, as in previous conference calls, Stronach asked for suggestic any prospective CEOs to be sent to MEC.

"Can I make a suggestion?" asked the caller. "You should go to Harvard MBA school or the University of Toronto for an MBA with experience. No disrespect to Ron, but just because horses -- I like horses, too -- doesn't mean that I or my son could run the company, no be than the company has been run in the last five or six years."

MEC has now reported net losses of \$402.1 million in the last four years combined. A plan raise up to \$700 million in capital by the end of 2008 has run into tough times due to wea markets in real estate and credit, Hodgson said.

"There are fewer interested parties for some properties than we expected, and some that found it more difficult to arrange financing than they expected," Hodgson said. "But my m to you is that we remain as committed to the successful implementation of the debt-elimin plan as we ever were. While the markets are not all on our side, we will continue to work hard over the next 10 months to achieve that goal."

MEC has classified Remington Park, Thistledown, Great Lakes Downs, and Portland Meado discontinued operations as of Dec. 31, 2007. All four tracks are for sale, as are former programmer programmer programmer programmer programmer programmer programmer programmer programmer.

Charles described his first two months as the company's chief operating officer as "challer Charles, who also currently serves as the president of Santa Anita Park, called the issues that track's synthetic surface "well documented," but also called Gulfstream Park's current disappointing.

"We continue to struggle at Gulfstream because of problems we are having with construct parking," Charles said of ongoing redevelopment of the South Florida complex. "On-track attendance and handle is down. And we continue to be disappointed with the fact that we unable to allow people to get to the racetrack and conveniently park."

Stronach also noted shareholder concern with the company's struggling stock price, and s company is considering a reverse stock split to help out the situation. MEC was notified Fe faced delisting from NASDAQ trading by mid-August unless it brought its stock price abov 10 consecutive days.

"I am very mindful of the poor performance of our stock in the marketplace, and I am cor to addressing the issues underlying that unsatisfactory performance," Stronach said. "I habeen personally been working very hard on our key strategic initiatives that I hope will co (fruition) in the future."

MEC's stock price has closed under \$1 for 43 straight days, and was trading at about 80 c during mid-day trading Feb. 29.

## DRAFT OF LETTER TO SENATOR VINCENT'S OFFICE

Bay Meadows, Golden Gate Fields and seven Racing Fairs have had a 60+ year working relationship to promote the sport of horse racing in Northern California. Over time, there have been significant positive developments including the opening of 14 satellite wagering facilities and the advent of Advance Deposit Wagering. The recently passed AB241 will provide even more opportunity to present our sport to a wider audience.

While competition to our sport has grown dramatically over the past six decades, from lotteries to casino gaming, horse racing in California has been able to maintain a niche in the market without any expanding into new forms of gaming. However, over time, revenues have declined and land values have increased. These circumstances have created difficult decisions for race track owners.

Given Bay Meadows Land Company's decision to move ahead with the development of their property, it is more important now than ever, that the industry in Northern California stands firmly together to keep racing alive and well. The industry is ready to assist Bay Meadows with their transition and move the horses to alternate training facilities. We are deeply concerned about the impact on frontside employees, trainers and backstretch workers during this transition.

Through these difficult times has come unprecedented cooperation among the remaining parties in the industry to work together to share resources and grow the sport. By working together, we will create a more stable future for our employees, backstretch workers and trainers. While the road ahead will be a difficult one, the organizations signing below are committed to working within the industry and with the legislature to ensure the long-term viability of racing in Northern California.
