The bill would also specify that the California Gambling Control Commission is prohibited from issuing a gambling license unless it is satisfied that the applicant is a person of good moral character, honesty, and integrity. The bill would state the Legislature's intent to provide comprehensive reforms to the Gambling Control Act by this measure.

Summary: Would provide that moneys in the Tribal Nation Grant Fund are continuously appropriated without regard to fiscal year to the California Gambling Control Commission. The bill would require that moneys deposited into the Indian Gaming Revenue Sharing Trust Fund in excess of \$1,100,000 per eligible recipient Indian tribe shall be held and used for future disbursements or transferred to the Tribal Nation Grant Fund, and would specify how the commission should calculate the excess moneys. Summary: The Joint Exercise of Powers Act generally authorizes 2 or more public agencies, by agreement, to jointly exercise any common power. Under the act, if an agency is not one or more of the parties to the agreement but is a public entity, commission, or board constituted pursuant to the agreement, the debts, liabilities, and obligations of the agency are the debts, liabilities, and obligations of the parties to the agreement, unless the agreement specifies otherwise. The act also authorizes a party to a joint powers agreement to separately contract for, or assume responsibilities for, specific debts, liabilities, or obligations of the agency. This bill would eliminate that authorization, and would specify that if an agency established by a joint powers agreement participates in, or contracts with, a public retirement system, member agencies, both current and former to the

agreement, would be required to mutually agree as to the apportionment of the agency's retirement obligations among themselves, provided that the agreement equals the total retirement liability of the agency.

Summary: The Gambling Control Act requires a gambling enterprise employee to be issued a valid work permit by the commission or by a county, city, or city and county in order to be employed by a gambling enterprise, except as specified. The act defines a "gambling enterprise employee" as any natural person employed in the operation of a gambling enterprise, and the definition includes waiters, waitresses, and secretaries as examples of gambling enterprise employees. This bill would specifically exclude waiters, waitresses, and secretaries from the definition of a gambling enterprise employee.

Summary: Current law, under the Gambling Control Act, requires a person who is required to hold a state license to obtain the license before engaging in the activity or occupying the position with respect to which the license is required, except as specified. Current law also requires every person who, by order of the California Gambling Control Commission, is required to apply for a gambling license or a finding of suitability to file an application within 45 calendar days after receipt of the order. This bill would require the application described above to be filed within 90 calendar days after receipt of an order of the commission.

Summary: The California Horse Racing Board is authorized to permit a harness or quarter horse association conducting a horse race to accept wagers on the results of out-of-state, out-of-country, and other designated harness or quarter horse races, if specified conditions are met, including that the association conducts at least 7 live races and imports not more than 10 races on live racing days. A violation of the Horse Racing Law is a crime. This bill would also authorize wagering on a nightly program of out-of-country harness racing from a single racetrack, regardless of the number of those races, if specified conditions are met.

Summary: The Horse Racing Law provides that, for up to 2 races per night, for each race that is not imported under the maximum authorized by these provisions on a particular night of racing, the association may add a race to the number of races allowable under the maximum authorization on another night of racing. That law also provides, however, that no more than 2 races may be added

under these provisions to the number allowable on a single night, and the total number of imported races over a calendar year may not exceed the total number of imported races authorized pursuant to these provisions. This bill would increase the number of races that may be added per night to 3 races.

Summary: The California Constitution authorizes the Legislature to amend the percentage of gross receipts required to be dedicated to beneficial or charitable purposes by a statute passed by a 2/3 vote of each house of the Legislature. Current statutory law generally regulates raffles conducted by eligible organizations for beneficial or charitable purposes. Current statutory law requires the Department of Justice to administer and enforce those provisions. This bill would decrease the percentage of gross receipts from charitable raffles required to go to beneficial or charitable purposes from 90% to 50% for a raffle that generates gross ticket sale receipts less than \$1000, conducted by an eligible organization whose gross ticket sale receipts do not exceed \$5000 for all raffles in a calendar year.

For purposes of the act, existing law defines "applicant" as any person who has applied for, or is about to apply for, a state gambling license, or other licenses, permits, or approvals, as specified. This bill would revise the definition of "applicant" to no longer include a person who is about to apply for a state gambling license, or other licenses, permits, or approvals, as specified.

Summary: Current law authorizes the California Horse Racing Board to approve an additional 15 minisatellite wagering sites in each zone under certain conditions, including that no site is within 20 miles of a racetrack, a satellite wagering facility, or a tribal casino that has a satellite wagering facility. Current law provided that until January 1, 2013, if the proposed minisatellite wagering site is in the northern zone in a fair district where the fair has operated a satellite wagering facility for the previous 5 years, the approval of the fair must be obtained even if the proposed location is more than 20 miles from the existing satellite wagering facility operated by the fair. This bill would delete this obsolete provision.

Summary: Current law, the Horse Racing Law, requires each licensed racing association to designate a certain number of racing days to be conducted as charity days for the purpose of distributing the net proceeds to beneficiaries through a distributing agent. That law also requires that a separate 20% of the distribution be made to a nonprofit corporation or trust, of which the directors or trustees serve without compensation except for reimbursement for reasonable expenses, and for which the nonprofit

corporation or trust has as its sole purpose the accumulation of endowment funds, the income of which is distributed to qualified disabled jockeys. That law requires that when the nonprofit corporation or trust has received distributions in an amount equal to \$2,000,000, the distribution to the nonprofit corporation or trust ceases. This bill would remove the requirement that when the nonprofit corporation or trust has received distributions in an amount equal to \$2,000,000, the distribution to the nonprofit corporation or trust ceases.
